

Green Peas in a Glass Bowl

Instructions for using a wiggly eye and no-hole beads to make a serving dish of green peas

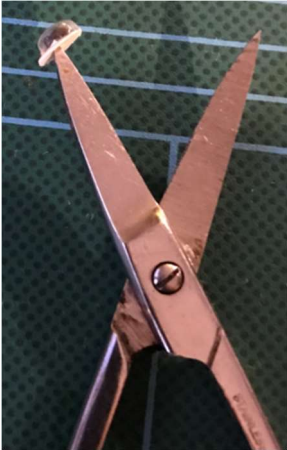
Supplies:

- You will want a wiggly eye that is $\frac{1}{4}$ inch or less at the flat base.
- Very fine no-hole beads (they can be any color)
- Green paint.
- Gloss varnish.

Tools:

- Craft knife and/or nail scissors
- Paint brush
- (Optional) Tweezers
- Toothpick
- White glue

1. Using your craft knife or Nail scissors make a hole in the bottom of the wiggly eye.



2. Slice or cut away the rest of the white bottom leaving the white plastic just on the edges of the clear part of the eye. Set aside the black disk for future use.



3. Touch up the white rim of the "bowl" if necessary, with white paint or paint it a different color if you prefer.



4. In a bottle cover or other small container, put some green paint and pour in a small amount of no-hole beads. Stir them into the paint to make sure the paint covers them.



5. Make a small mound of them and let them dry. Measure the mound and the inside of the bowl.



6. Gently remove any extra peas off the mound if it is too big and touch up with paint.
7. Once the little mound is dry, use your craft knife to gently loosen the mound of peas from the bottle cover. If you like, you can test the size of the mound against the inside of the "glass" bowl.
8. Mix some white glue with green paint and carefully put it in the bottom of the "glass" bowl.



9. Carefully set the mound of peas on top of the glue/paint.



10. Brush on a small amount of gloss varnish on the peas.
