



## BOTTLES AND JARS

### Materials

Beads - small and large seed beads. Small square beads will work too.

Cardboard

Q-tip

1/16" circle punch

Exacto knife

Silver marker or silver paint

Colored nail polish

Tacky glue



For the tiny jars, punch circles out of cardboard and paint them silver. It's easier to stick these to a piece of painter's tape to hold them in place. Paint the sides too.

When dry add one of the painted circles to the top of the small seed beads.



For the larger jars, cut one end off of a Q-tip. Paint the stick with nail polish. Craft paint will work too, but then you would want a coat of gloss over top. Nail polish does both in one step.

When dry, cut thin slivers off the Q-tip. They might become oval shaped when cutting them. If so, just squeeze them between your tweezers and they will become round again. Glue these slices to the larger beads. When dry, add a dab of nail polish to the top and your jar is done.
