



LARGE DRESSER

BPF dresser - scrap of cardboard - no hole beads

Sand the knobs off the dresser and spray white primer or paint.

Next, we want to fill in the opening. Start with a piece of scrap wood. The scrap wood is just to fill the hole so you have something to glue to. I used 1/4" x 1/4" strip wood. Cut a piece of cardboard 9/16" x 3/8" and test fit. Trim if needed. You want it to fit flush to fill the opening. Once it fits well, glue in the scrap wood and the cardboard on top. Cut 2 pieces 1/4" x 5/16" out of cardboard and glue these over the cardboard you just added to create doors.



Paint the dresser the color of your choice. I used Ceramcoat Blue Heaven.

When dry, cover the top and drawers with the striped printie. I cut out a strip of the flowers just tall enough for the flowers to show. Then I cut it into little strips 2 flowers wide. These went over the small drawers. The strip for the large drawer is 5 flowers wide. Glue these to the drawers. The doors were made from a strip where I centered the flowers and trimmed each side to fit. Once they are the correct size, glue these on. Cut a strip to fit the top and glue it on. Add no hole beads as knobs to the drawers and doors.

Once it's all dry, spray the piece with clear matte finish.
